MINUTES OF THE STATE PRIMARY ELECTION SEPTEMBER 9, 2014

The ballots were delivered to the polls from Town Hall by Town Clerk Carol Mollica and Officer Halloway at 6:15 AM.

The ballot boxes were opened and examined by Officer Halloway, with Asst. Town Clerk Ellen Wojcik and Warden Mary Geromini assisting. A test tabulation was run and the zero results were posted. The AutoMARK handicap voting machine was turned on. The keys were handed over to Officer Halloway.

The polls were opened at 7:00 am with the reading of the warrant by Warden Mary Geromini. There were two voters standing in line to cast their ballots. Sample ballots, Instructions to Voters, and the Voters Bill of Rights were posted.

The election workers were sworn in and their reminders and instructions for write-ins were reviewed.

Officers on duty during the day were Officer David Halloway, Officer Jonathan Coliflores, Officer Daniel Morriss, and Lt. Michael Robillard.

At the close of registration for this election, there were 7,700 registered voters. Voter turnout was very slow at the beginning and continued slow for the entire day, which is typical of a primary election. In the first hour, .57% of the voters had cast their ballots.

There was the usual number of inactive voters processed, and a few voters who thought they were registered in a different party or registered as Unenrolled. They were given party change cards if they wanted to change their party. There were an unusual number of inactive voters who complained about having to show an ID to become active again. The process was explained, and although the voters eventually showed their ID's, they were not happy about it.

All voting machines ran well with no problems. There was one provisional ballot in Precinct which was placed in the side pocket.

At 8:00 pm, Warden Geromini declared the polls officially closed. There were no voters waiting to vote. The workers immediately started reconciling their books, and the computers were programmed for tabulation. Results of the election were available by approximately 9:00 PM, excluding the write-in votes. The Warden read the unofficial results to those present. There were 923 voters who had cast ballots, or 11.98%. The last regular state primary drew 9.2% of the registered voters.

There were 8 Affirmations of Current and Continuous Residence for Inactive Voters in Precinct 1; 6 in Precinct 2; and 5 in Precinct 3. There was one provisional ballot, and six spoiled ballots.

All materials were returned to Town Hall at approximately 10:30 pm.
