**Minutes of the State Election**  
**November 6, 2018**

Polls were declared open at 7:00 a.m. by Warden Mary Geromini. There were at least 50 voters standing in line to cast their ballots at 6:45 a.m. The Specimen Ballot, Instructions to Voters, Voters Bill of Rights, and Zero Tabulations from Precinct 1, Precinct 2 and Precinct 3 were posted. The AutoMark handicap voting machine was turned on and operational by 6:30 a.m.

Town Clerk, Cynthia Thompson, swore in and thanked the Election Workers for coming. The group reviewed the election worker procedures (early voting processing), the rules of materials regarding candidates and sworn in the staff. Brochures for Q1, Q2 and Q3 were made available in each voting booth.

The Town Clerk's office would like to thank the Department of Public Works, the Elementary School custodians and the Wrentham Police Department who helped with the setup and take down of the equipment.

Officers on duty were: Officer Peter Preston, Sergeant Rick Mayhew, Sergeant Jeffrey Smith and Sergeant Daniel Morris.

The ballot boxes were opened by Sergeant Smith with Warden Mary Geromini observing. The boxes proved to be empty and the zero tabulations were run and posted. The keys were handed over to Sergeant Smith and then to Sergeant Mayhew.

The turnout was steady with over 800 voters casting their ballot by 9:00 a.m. At the time of the Election, there were 8,541 registered voters in Wrentham.

235 Absentee Ballots and 1351 Early Voter Ballots were processed by the Precinct Clerks during the day.

Several individuals took advantage of the handicap Automark voting machine. All of these voters commented on how easy it was to read the ballot.

We had issues with the ballot bleeding right from the start of the opening of the polls. Quite a few residents commented on the problem and thought there would be an issue with their vote. Ms. Thompson contacted the Secretary of State – Election Division office to alert them of the complaint on behalf of the residents.

Due to the periodic rain storms, residents who came to vote made their ballots wet by handling them. There were several issues with ripped, torn and soggy wet ballots. Precinct 2 Accuvote became jammed. The Officer on duty tried to dislodge the piece of the ballot, but was unsuccessful. From then on, ballots were deposited into the hand count pocket on the ballot boxes. Ms. Thompson contact LHS who delivered a spare machine. A ballot count was taken and the flash card was installed into the spare machine. The count remained the same and voters began running their ballots through once again.

There were a few issues with Precinct 3 Accuvote also jamming, but each time, the attempt to clear was successful.

After about 1 ½ hours on the replacement Accuvote machine operating properly in Precinct 2, another jam happened. The attempt to dislodge was again unsuccessful. Ms. Thompson once again contacted LHS and a 2<sup>nd</sup> replacement machine was delivered. The same procedure was followed with the hand count pocket and the flash card. This 3<sup>rd</sup> machine held up throughout the rest of the election until 8 pm.

There were no issues with Precinct 1 all day.


Turnout remained steady throughout the day with approximately 3,000 voters casting their ballot by 3:00 p.m.

At 8:00 p.m. Warden Geromini closed the polls. There was one voter waiting to cast their ballot. The voting machines were programmed for tabulation and two sets of tapes were run. Tellers worked on reconciling their books and write-in votes were recorded. Results were completed around 10:35 p.m.

There were no provisional ballots, 51 spoiled ballots, and a total of 227 Affirmations. At 8:00 p.m. a total of 5,572 voters cast their ballots, or 65.2%.

All materials were returned to Town Hall by 11:00 p.m. Un-official results were sent to the local newspapers and results were reported the Associated Press. Official results were posted in Town Hall on Thursday.

The Town Clerk gives a special thank you to the Assistant Town Clerk, Ellen Wojcik and all the staff members and volunteers who stayed all day to make it another successful election.
