



Town of Wrentham - Office of the Town Clerk 2022 Dog License Application – Due 2/28/22

Do You Own a Dog(s)? Get Their License Today!

- Dog licensing due **January 1st thru the last day in February**. Up to date **Rabies** is a **MUST!**
- Dog licenses after last day in February (**late fines of \$50.00 per dog apply per Mass General Law**).
- Dog licenses after May 1st (**additional late fines \$100.00 per dog per Wrentham Bylaws**).
- **All Late Fines will Apply in 2022**
- All dogs six (6) months or older, moving to Wrentham must be licensed with 60 days.

What are the Fees?

Male/Female (Intact) - \$20.00 per dog -OR- Male/Female (Spayed/Neutered) - \$12.00 per dog	
Kennel 1 - \$50.00 (5-10 dogs) Kennel 2 - \$75.00 (11-25 dogs) Kennel 3 - \$100.00 (26 and above dogs)	A household with more than four dogs is considered a kennel. Planning Board approval must be obtained before a kennel license is purchased.

How Do I Obtain a License(s)?

2. Stop by the Town Clerk’s Office during normal business hours.
3. Order by US mail. Enclose completed application, **SASE**, and check made out to the “Town of Wrentham”, and mail to Town Clerk, 79 South Street, Wrentham, MA 02093.

It is the owner’s responsibility to license their dogs by the last day in February.

Did you know that the average dog can produce nearly a pound of waste each day?

- When pet waste washes into storm drains and waterways, it can make the water unhealthy for people and wildlife.
